Summary

A listed farmhouse of medieval origin, which was extensively re-modelled in c.1600 and later altered and re-faced in the early 19th century. The farmhouse is of yellowish-brown brick with a tiled roof and was probably originally built as an open hall with 2 or 3 bays. Inside there is also exposed square panelling with wattle and daub infill plastered and what appears to be the remains of a cruck blade also surviving.
