He also visited our French licensees, Dia Prosim to help with building trade applications of Evomastics and to lay a plan for the general sale of Flashband.

Allweather Evode Paints report a variety of export orders totalling almost £3,000 from Jordan, Iran and Sweden.

HOME SALES NEWS

There has been valuable activity in the Evomastics field, particularly with Plevogun, where £2,000 worth of this product will be used on a new office block at Wolverhampton by Tarmac Construction Limited and £3,500

worth will be used by A. Monk & Co., on a new building for I.C.I. at Manchester.

Allweather Evode Paints are being used on the new Foden Factory at Sandbach (400 gallons) and in the packaging area at the Bass Charrington Brewery at Runcorn.

Building Chemicals Division report increased interest in Silverfilm after the new sales approach; orders amounting to 500-gallons being received in only 3 days,

Ebor Concrete of Ripon have bought 32 packs of Concrete Repair Composition and 200 gallons of Rubeton have been sold to a customer in London.

The Industrial Adhesives Sales seem to be "doing a ton", in particular a ton of Evo-Stik 188 to Dents of Letchworth, a ton of Evo-Stik BLG.89 to Commercial Plastics and 10-tons of Evo-Stik RDB.4436 to Metal Box, Manchester.

Finally, from the home sales news, Allweather Evode Paints have had news of the motor vessel "Scotspark" which was painted with their chlorinated rubber to protect the hull topsides and boottopping over 12 months ago and the coating is reported to be still exceptionally good and bright in appearance.

OVERSEAS and EXPORT NEWS

Taking it from the top as they say, News Circular records the appointment of Mr. J.J.E. Forman as Export Director. Mr. Forman has long had an interest in export matters dating

from the time when our exports were mainly roof waterproofing materials thus being associated with one of his other interests, and the situation is now crystallised in this new appointment where a Director of Evode is specifically associated with export matters.

EXPORT ORDERS

Several outstanding export orders have been received recently, including nearly £3,000 worth of Evo-Stik 528 for Nigeria, £1,500 worth of Thermaflo 8428 for the Formosa Republic of China and £5,000 worth of Flashband for Holland.

Allweather Evode Paints received an order for Pitalic from Cyprus valued at £425 and one for Crane Paints from Eire valued at £740.

OVERSEAS VISITORS

Our Licensee in France, Dia-Prosim figured largely amongst recent visitors. On the 15th January Mr. C. Reverchon of Dia-Prosim visited Stafford in the company of three executives of Peintures Gauthier, one of the largest paint manufacturers in France. It is intended that Peintures Gauthier will act as selling agents for the industrial Evo-Stick adhesives to be manufactured by Dia-Prosim in France with the exception of the Shoe Trade.

INDUSTRIAL MASTICS SALES LAUNCH

The latest Evomastics Industrial Sales Launch was a very vigorous affair held on Friday, 22nd January when several new products were launched, including THIOMER, a pitch poly-sulphide horizontal joint sealant, and an entirely new formula for GX-5 including a variety of attractive colours. In addition to the Representatives and Regional Managers, the launch was attended by the Export Department and the Architects and Engineers Advisory Department.

The presence in Stafford of Mr. Cerf and Mr. Guilloux of Dia-Prosim made it possible for them to attend this Mastics Sales Launch as well.

The Industrial Mastics Sales Force also recorded the following orders :

£9,000 worth of Evobar S.C.225 for Taylor Woodrow, 1,000 cartridges of White Silicone Sealant for Concargo and £7,000 worth of Polevogun for Foreman and McGee.

NEWS FROM THE FACTORY

The new Flashband machine is now installed and in production.

On Tuesday, 15th December, 1970 members of the Evode Works Fire Brigade visited Rugeley Power Station for a talk about fire hazards and prevention at the Power Station and a conducted tour of it.

On the 4th January we were visited by Junior Firemen attending an Electrical Engineering course at Stafford College of Further Education. This visit was to allow them to inspect certain electrical installations.

NEW DEPOT

Mr. J.K. Shardlow reports that new depot premises were opened at North Shields on the 1st January.

VIKFORM GAINS FURTHER CONTRACTS

This product continues to gain acceptance, evidence for this being the following recent contracts of a considerable monetary value.

A contract from H.S. Solomans, negotiated by Mr. R.A. Gill; with S. Edge Sons Ltd., Bilston, negotiated by Mr. C.W. Cooper, and Mr. K.J. Robinson has negotiated a contract with Lotus Limited.

RETIREMENT of MR. C.L. WILLIAMSON

Although reported elsewhere, News Circular would like to remark on the retirement of Mr. C.L. Williamson. Although his services will still be available in a consultative capacity, Mr. Williamson retired from active service on 31st

January, 1971. He was Manager of our Roof Waterproofing Contracts Division for more than 23 years and his Managership saw the growth of this Division from very small beginnings to its present position as one of the principal activities of the Company. Mr. Williamson helped considerably to build a good name for Evode in the field of roof waterproofing, and through this indirectly strengthened the name of the Company in the Building Industry generally.

MR. R.J. EDWARDS

At the A.G.M. of Evode Limited, Mr. R.J. Edwards was elected a Director of the Company. Mr. Edwards is also a Director of Evomastics Limited.

THE POSTAL STRIKE,

Although all being well this issue of the News Circular will see the end of the postal strike, the event should not pass without some comment, for in spite of the strike a large volume of the business went on as usual or "unusual" with Representatives delivering invoices and statements and collecting cheques in addition to their normal duties. A large part of the effort fell on to our Switchboard Operators and a "thank you" to them for this extra effort is not out of place. During the dispute Mrs. Luscombe informs us that all calls through the Exchange reached a peak of 2,000 calls per day and in February there were 1,470 telex messages.

THE WANDERERS RETURN

In the last issue we mentioned a number of people who had gone abroad on Company business and they have now all come home to roost. Mr. M.E.J. Wright, Managing Director of Cox & Wright visited South Africa and whilst there gave a talk to the B.B.S.I. in Port Elizabeth with particular reference to high frequency welding. Mr. V. Vohralik, also in South Africa, came home via visits to our associates in Kenya, Cyprus, Greece and Italy. Mr. J.D. Roche visited the Middle East and reports increased business for the Company's products with particular interest for establishment of local manufacture in Iran. Mr. S.B. Knowlden visited South Africa and several other African States and also reports expanding business. Flashband was exhibited in the South African Building Exhibition in Johannesburg and drew tremendous interest.

INDUSTRIAL ADHESIVES DIVISION CONFERENCE

This Sales Conference was held at Stafford on Thursday and Friday, 25th and 26th February to launch a new product GUN-O-PRENE. This is an adhesive packed in mastic cartridges and suitable for gun application. It is particularly useful for fixing large panels to walls in buildings and the Conference was given details of the sales campaign for this product and also for Floor Levelling Compound with particular emphasis on shop fitters and builders.

WHAT'S NEW ? - TIGER GLUE

You may have seen the pretty tiger on the white bottle - that is Tiger Glue. It is an emulsion adhesive at present sold through the Fonadek Company. It is a lot better than many of the adhesives that are sold for simple assemblies as it dries completely clear and sticks a wide range of light-weight components such as paper, fabrics, cardboard, etc.

SEAL DEAL

ConCargo, container manufacturers, have bought 3,000 cartridges of RDM.2501.

OVERSEAS VISITORS

Mr. Th.W. Steenvoorden and Mr. C.J. Keijzer both of our Dutch Licensees, Simson, visited Evode on separate occasions during February. Cox & Wright was visited by Mr. C. Bielfeldt from Albeko, Germany and Mr. J. Hoffman of Continental Shoe Products, Nashville, U.S.A.

ALLWEATHER COME CLEAN

The building work is all completed at Gillingham and the Works was visited by Dr. H. Simon on Friday, 12th February, who has reported to your Editor that he was very

impressed with the layout and above all with its cleanliness of operation, where (and we quote) " certain departments of the Stafford factory could still take a lesson."

Not being idle on the sales front either, Allweather have received intimation of an order for over 5,000-gallons of Pitch Epoxy Coating from Abu Dhabi. The British Air-ports Authority will use Pitan Roadmarking Paint for Edinburgh Airport and British Rail will use Allweather Evode materials for Canon Street Bridge, London.

BEST SELLER

It is slightly ridiculous to call a give away booklet a best "seller" but the success of the Evo-Stik Resin 'W' booklet outlining basic Do-it-Yourself techniques has been much more successful than we anticipated and has attracted favourable comment from several quarters. One comment was that in the Sunday Times for 21st February which also mentioned the Evo-Stik designs for furniture and toys.

TALKATIVE BOFFINS

A lecture was presented by Mr. S.F. Broadgate and supported by Mr. L. Ramsey to architects, engineers and quantity surveyors of the Sunderland Borough Council.

This meeting was very successful even to the extent that Mr. Broadgate and Mr. Ramsey were conducted back to the Assistant Borough Architect's office immediately after the lecture. GX-5 was written into the standard specification for future use by the Borough.

A lecture was also presented by Dr. M.J. Welch on mastic sealing compounds and Mr. H.E. Akerman on epoxy resins to Bylander, Waddell and Partners, Consulting Engineers, Wembley, London in support of a teach-in by the Architects and Engineers Service Division,

NEWS THAT VIK SUPPLIES

After many years service as a Technical Representative, Mr. F. Brown is leaving the Company. He will not be replaced as the sales areas will be reorganised.

The Company has received an order for 1,000-yds. of 48" wide Hot Melt Cast Film from C.D. Bailey of South Africa.

Almost £4,000 worth of Printapuff material has been supplied to our Italian associates, Zucchini.

NEW NOSES FROM EVODE

The edges of joints in motorway bridges get a terrific hammering from the traffic and ordinary concrete is too weak to resist this without crumbling, and to prevent this the edges of the joints or "nosings" are now being formed using Evode Epoxy Resin Compositions. You may have seen the M5 extensions mentioned in the press, and on this site, which was visited on 2nd April by Mr. B. Liss in the company of Mr. E. Nixon, Friary Construction Limited of Lichfield have used about 16-tons of our nosing compound in the joint construction. Because of their tremendous strength compared to concrete Evode compositions are finding increasing use in civil engineering, and in addition to the nosings about 5-tons of the Concrete Repair Composition have been supplied to the Department of the Environment at Donnington, Salop and the Midlands Electricity Board, Civil Engineering Department have specified the same product for repairs to concrete columns carrying the overhead grid system.

These products are relatively recent additions to the range of Evode Epoxy Resin Compositions which also includes the well-known items E.F.T. and Evoscreed.

NO WATER UNDER THE BRIDGE

Bridges seem to be in the news this month because the Roof Waterproofing Contracts Department have received a contract for the supply and fix of waterproofing to the deck of the A13 viaduct at Basildon. This was a specification obtained through the Basildon Development Corporation in co-operation with the Ministry of Transport. Also involved on this contract are the Evomastics Contracts Department for the supply and fix of sealing compounds, and the total value to Evode will probably be more than £40,000.

A large car park for the City of Coventry is to be waterproofed with the same type of system and the concrete topping in this case will also incorporate Waterbars, Flashband and Plevomastic.

COMINGS AND GOINGS

Dr. H. Simon attended the Annual General Meetings of Evode Industries Limited and Vik Plastics Limited on 24th/25th February. Apparently a recent land acquisition at Evode Industries has also brought in the fishing rights emanating from the stream forming the boundary of the newly acquired land which is intended for future extensions of the factory.

Dr. Simon also visited our licensee Simsons in Holland and associated company Batu in Germany who now have very impressive new offices and warehouses. The Batu visit was on the 11th/12th March and on the 18th/19th March Dr. Simon visited our Italian licensee Ditta Fratelli Zucchini.

There were several visitors to Cox & Wright Limited including Mr. Spapens of Bloch & Stibbe and Mr. Van Sambeek, a manufacturer of men's shoes in Holland. Mr. Leo Mateijsen of Holland, Mr. Harry Earle of Johnsons, Australia and Mr. J. Whittle and Mr. Goldman of Feltex, South Africa.

Also from Cox & Wright, Mr. W.T. Clifton and Mr. Leon Mikolajewicz went to Leipzig to attend the Leipzig Fair where the Company had been exhibiting.

Mr. Zuckerman of Evomex our licensee in Mexico will be visiting Stafford on 5th/ 6th April accompanied by his wife.

Mr. Roy Macpherson, Director of Allweather Evode Paints Limited made a special visit to France to progress special samples urgently

required for the Tower Lumiere project which apparently will be something to rival the Eiffel Tower when completed. Also in March we were visited by Mr. Oskoui from Adinco Incorporated in Iran, more of which later.

We were also visited by Mr. P.W. Draper from South Africa who is interested in the possibility of manufacture of some Evode products in that country.

EXPORT AGAIN

Allweather Evode Paints Limited report export orders received in March from Abu Dhabi, Abadan, New Zealand and Hong Kong.

Our Assistant Export Sales Manager, Mr. J.D. Roche is leaving on another Export Sales Trip on April 16th for a month. In case the exotic places he will visit could favourably stimulate the imagination of our Readers, perhaps by producing visions of Harems, Camels, Oases and the hot sun beating down on thirsty Legionnaires crawling towards the haven of the distant Fort, they are : BAHRAIN, DOHA, ABU DHABI-DHAHRAN-RIYADH-JEDDAH-ADEN-BEIRUT and ATHENS.

The Export Sales Manager, Mr. S.B. Knowlden has expressed his appreciation to the Sales Office and the Stafford Factory for the careful planning and processing of a large order for Evokote Type 23 destined for the Arabian Gulf.

A NEW LICENSEE

A new licence agreement has been signed with two companies in Iran which will become active once Iranian Government approval has been obtained. The two companies are the Poldasht Company and Adinco Incorporated both of Teheran and this licence is unusual inasmuch that it is to cover the manufacture of bitumen emulsions, roof waterproofing materials and building chemicals, with Poldasht making the bituminous emulsions and Adinco the cement admixtures.

The licence agreement was signed during the recent visit of Mr. Oskoui of Adinco Incorporated, and during the negotiation it was necessary for Mr. H. Venton, Divisional Chief Chemist of the Building Chemicals and Bitumen Division to visit Teheran to study the suitability of the factory and the equipment already owned by the Poldasht Company.

NEW BITUMEN PLANT AT STAFFORD

Our new and enlarged Bitumen Emulsion Plant is now on stream, just in time to cope with the anticipated increased demands for roof waterproofing materials.

NEW APPOINTMENTS

Mr. R. Clarke of Dundee has joined us as a Sales Representative for parts of Scotland.

Mr. J.W. Bird has been appointed Product Group Manager in the reorganised Marketing Department, and Mr. P.L. Brook has been appointed Assistant Product Manager with the responsibility for Industrial products generally.

MORE HOME SALES NEWS

Evomastics Flamseal is to be used in fixing cladding panel joints in two projects sponsored by the Ministry of Works in London. If we had not been in a position to supply a material like Flamseal eliminating the risk of the passage of flame between the panel joints under fire conditions, it is very doubtful if the Ministry would have permitted the use of G.R.P. panels in this environment.

Allweather Evode Paints report several successes including the use of Thixochlor on 165 caustic liquor rail tankers for British Petroleum.

As a result of the excellent performance of our materials under severe conditions on the cranes at Folkestone our systems are to be used again on all British Rail projects at Folkestone and Dover. They will also be used

on a crane at Clydebank and on the British Rail Cranes Building in Finland.

An order for more than £1,000 worth of Detel Marina anti-fouling paint has been received from a stockist in Dorset.

SEALANT MANUFACTURERS CONFERENCE

Evomastics Limited have been members of the above Conference since its inception in association with what is now known as the British Rubber Manufacturers Association. This latter association is, of course, very much concerned with the rubber industry generally of which sealants only form a very small part and the S.M.C. has now been established as a self-sufficient organisation independent of the B.R.M.A. Our Company is a founder member of the new organisation and Mr. A.J. Carwardine, Sales Manager of the Evomastic Industrial Division, is the Chairman of the S.M.C. for this year.

TAIL ENDER FROM VIK

We often seem to end with a spot of cheery news from Vik and this month it is that the Company has obtained a contract order for P.V.C. compound from Stylo Shoes to the value of about £75,000.

CRIMINAL ACTIVITIES

Flashband has received the attention of several Chief Crime Prevention Officers in various Police Forces. The reason is that being self-adhesive and less expensive than lead it offers a means of flashing and waterproofing which is less tempting to the thief than the more expensive and more easily portable traditional lead. We have the law on our side for once.

We have also been successful in obtaining orders for Electrostatic Chlorinated Rubber paint for security fences at H.M. Prisons. This is a product of Allweather Evode Paints Limited and is to be applied by airless spray. Painting these fences may help to keep us on the right side of the law !

Everything seems to be export sales news this month. At the risk of raising somebody's wrath, we have included in home sales some news from Evode Industries Limited about the sale of two products overseas - (sounds a bit Irish !) Swords tell us that they have recently launched GUN-O-PRENE and FLASHBAND and from first impressions and the way in which the products have been received by their customers, it is felt that both products are going to be amongst the best sellers of the future.

Evomastics Industrial Division has received an order from G. Percy Trentham for almost £2,000 worth of rubber Waterstops.

The Building Chemicals Division has received orders for 4,000 gallons of bitumen emulsion for use at R.A.F. Cosford, 1,000 gallons of Silverfilm from the Department of the Environment and 20 packs of epoxy resin mortar for use on cooling towers at Spondon, Derby.

F.E.R.F.A.ing SECRETARY

Mr. H.E. Akerman of the Technical Service Laboratory has been appointed Secretary of F.E.R.F.A., which is the Federation of Epoxy Resin Formulators and Applicators. Most of the sales items in this month's news concern export activities. Starting with

Allweather Evode Paints Limited, who have received orders from Malta, Dubai, Iran and the New Hebrides. Also one from West Germany worth more than £2,000 for Zinc Rich Primer and Chlorinated Rubber Paint. These will be used on container ships.

For a new hotel in Gambia, 5,000 sq. yds. of the Roof Waterproofing System are to be supplied and also sufficient Evoseal 202 for about 5,000 sq. yds. of damp-proof membrane. This order was obtained in co-operation with the Architects and Engineers Service Division.

There has been further excellent business in Flashband from South Africa, where an order is in production for over 1,500 rolls of the product. The Factory has also reported a further export order for over 7,000 yds. of Roof Waterproofing System, including Silver-film.

To show just what heights exports can achieve, we have received an order for 5 gallons of RDA.5182 adhesive for use on the French Concorde.

The activity needed to get these export orders is illustrated by the fact that Mr. J.D. Roche, Assistant Export Manager, is currently on a sales tour covering most Middle Eastern countries, and Mr. S.B. Knowlden, Export Sales Manager, is shortly to visit West Africa and develop sales in existing areas of operation and to visit new areas e.g. Libya and the Ivory Coast.

Mr. J.D. Roche, Assistant Export Sales Manager, visited the Middle and Far East during July and August with regard to reorganisation of agency arrangements in Thailand, Singapore and Malaysia and initial approach to the Philippines should ensure that our position in the area is strengthened.

DIAGRAM I





FIFTY YEARS FOR ZUCCHINIS

Our prospective licensees in the Republic of South Africa have already secured a contract for our materials in Pinetown near Durban.


VIK WAGS TAIL AGAIN
