



### **GROUP PERSONNEL EXECUTIVE APPOINTED**





In addition, the move to sling-back shoe fashions greatly reduces the potential sales volume in any case. However, business is brighter in the Southern area where, in spite of short-time working in the industry, sales of products continue to run at a reasonably high level.

### **EXAMPLES FROM EXPORT**


