Camp before Sebastopol July 9<sup>th</sup> 1855.

My dear Father,

I got off rather easy in the trenches the other day as I had very little to do. I saw Colonel Seymour the a few days ago up in his camp as the Guards and Highlanders have come up to within a mile and a half of us and when I came back again I had not been at home

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ten minutes before M<sup>r</sup>
Boudier came and intro
duced himself he is stopping
now up at the 3<sup>rd</sup> Division
doing duty, lately we are
sapping slowly up from
the Mamelon & Quarries
to the Round Tower and
Redan. I enclose a plan
of the advance of the right
attack so you will now
be able to see our attack
on the Redan better than
you otherwise would have
done I will now tell <first explain to> you

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the plan. All the Brown Tren ches were made before the

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Quarries were taken those marked in red we made on the night of the Quarries the green are old Russian tren ches & those parts that have green & yellow have been reversed scince [sic] & are occupied by troops in the day time whereas the green ones are only occupied at night. The yellow ones have all been made scince [sic] the Quarries were taken On the day of the Quarries Browne & I started from Edgertons Pits cross to the Quarries & I have before given you an account of the row & the morning after

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wards I was hit at the place marked (w) in the Quarries. I forgot to mention that all the trenches painted pure yellow were made after the day of the Redan I will now tell you about the Redan in the middle of the night we marched down to the trench marked (aa) where we waited till about 4 oclock the 34th were formed up in rear of the trench marked (a) & started a little before us but we were up as soon as they were: Well we started out of the trench by the dotted line marked (bbb) <and followed it> till we got to the abattis

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marked (ccc). I got up to them at the place marked (w) where I was wounded I lay there (as I c<sup>d</sup> not use my arm) for about 5 or 10 minutes when we retired so I was obliged to go back with the rest & I went along the dotted line (fff) back into the Quarries. The abattis

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are made of boughs of trees entangled together & pointed so it is all a fellow can do to get through them at least for 5 minutes or so during which time you are exposed to the most deadly fire. The sapping up to the Redan is I believe to be conducted

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along the ravine marked (dd) when it will be out of sight of the Redan & Round Tower. To give you an idea of the distance their guns took effect. The grape from the Redan took effect as far as the crooked line marked (p) on the right of the plan so we could not get out of the fire all the way up to the Redan. I have just received your letter of the 23<sup>rd</sup> saying you had received my letter of the 8<sup>th</sup> June as well as one from M<sup>r</sup> Bracebridge

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at Constantinople enclosing
your letter to M<sup>rs.</sup> Brace
bridge Thank little Anna
for her letter & best
love to all at home &
Believe me to remain
Y[ou]<sup>r</sup> ever affec[tiona]<sup>te</sup> Son
